

Report from the Business Committee Wednesday, May 9, 2018

TOPICS: 2018-19 Five-Year Capital Plan Aboriginal Education Surplus and Deficit Policy Graduation Rates

**CAPITAL PLAN** – Secretary-Treasurer Carrie McVeigh shared the <u>2018-19 Five-Year Capital</u> <u>Plan and Bylaws</u>.

The Committee recommended that the Board approve all three readings of the Capital Bylaw at the May 23, 2018 Regular Board meeting.

Funding for public school buildings and structural improvements is shared between the provincial government and boards of education. Resources are allocated fairly and in a cost-effective way. For more information on the capital planning process, visit the Government of B.C.'s <u>website</u>.

**ABORIGINAL EDUCATION** – Assistant Superintendent Laura Tait and District Vice-Principal of Aboriginal Education Anne Tenning, provided an <u>overview</u> of Aboriginal Education in the district.

For the 2018-19 school year, the Aboriginal Education Department plans to: allocate additional school administration time to the district's most vulnerable Focus Schools; launch an *Elders in Schools* pilot project; and implement many other Aboriginal Education initiatives across the district.
