BOARD INITIATIVES - On Wednesday, May 24, 2017, the Nanaimo Ladysmith Public Schools' Board of Education agreed to enter into a policy development notice of motion:

- To refer the matter of Trustee Remuneration to public consultation for an amendment to the current policy on Trustee Remuneration (Board Governance Policy 2.6 Meetings and Board Operations – Section 7.1.1) to read: "Trustee Remuneration is to be reviewed by the Board in September each year; such review is to be based on remuneration paid to trustees of comparable British Columbia School Districts."
- The Board entered into public consultation seeking feedback on the possibility of reducing the number of trustees from nine to seven in the 2018 municipal election. For more information, please refer to the <u>Secretary-Treasurer's report</u> from the May 10, 2017 Business Committee meeting.

Staff, partner groups and the general public had the opportunity to provide feedback until Friday, September 8, 2017. In total, there were 72 respondents in the online survey.

The Business Committee recommended that the Board continue with its current policy on remuneration. The topic of the reduction of trustees will be discussed at the next Business Committee meeting in October.
