RE: École North Oyster Elementary Active School Travel Project

To the Honourable Rob Fleming;

On behalf of the Nanaimo Ladysmith Public Schools' Board of Education ("Board") I write to request reconsideration of your Ministry's decision to not support recommendations put forward by a Stakeholder Committee in reference to École North Oyster Elementary's *Active School Travel Project*.

Background

Issues at the school include poor accommodation on school site for daily transportation demands, insufficient parking, vehicle speeds in school zones, ineffective signage, unsafe crossing, insufficient lighting, unsafe roadway for users, and shortage of road safety awareness and training for students and families.

A School Travel Action Plan was completed in 2019 and a Stakeholder Committee was put together, including District Staff, Ministry of Transportation & Infrastructure (MOTI), ICBC and District Facilities staff, to make recommendations based on the Plan.

To date, the school district has completed:

- The placement of an adult Crossing Guard
- #2 Installation of dynamic speed sign on school property
- #3 Installing an asphalt pathway from the crosswalk to the front entrance of school
- #5 Installing barriers to protect parking entrances

• Lease renewal with the North Oyster Community Centre which includes the use of their parking lot for Drop-off and Pick-up in exchange for water supply and snow clearing

To date, NLPS has funded approximately \$38,000 on improvements and \$12,000 per year in Crossing Guard expenses on the Active School Travel Project.

Once again, the Board respectfully requests that the Ministry reconsider the priorities previously not supported as it feels Ministry support is needed to address community concerns and ensure students make it to and from school safely.
