

Online Crime Reporting Tool

The RCMP is piloting a new online crime reporting tool, expected to be launched in early December 2019.

The online reporting tool will provide an alternate way for citizens to report less serious crimes, such as bike or property theft valued under \$5,000; lost property; as well as damage and/or mischief to property or vehicle under \$5,000.

The tool is intended for crimes where there is no suspect or witness and follow from a police officer is not required.

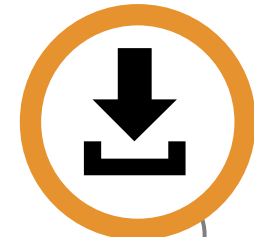


Speaker Series

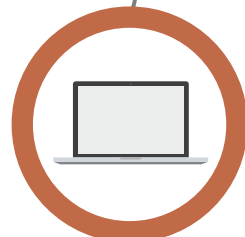

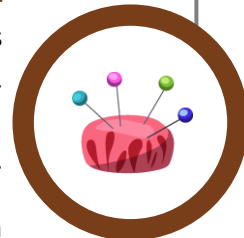


Craft Fair
